10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

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12 Section 1. Division 2 of Article IV of Chapter 38 shall be amended by adding the language 13 underlined and deleting the language stricken to read as follows:

14 Sec. 38-116. – Defined terms.

(12) Law enforcement officer means police officers, sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, Colorado State 15 16 patrol officers, POST certified corrections officers, marshals, deputy marshals, district attorney 17 investigators, Colorado Bureau of Investigation agents, parole or probation officers, or federal law 18 enforcement officers, while engaged in the performance of their official duties or while engaged in 19 off-duty employment. The term "law enforcement officer" also includes peace officers described in 20 part 1 of article 2.5 of title 16, C.R.S., as amended, while engaged in the performance of their duties.

21 Sec. 38-118. – Unlawful carrying of weapons.

22 (c) Exceptions. It shall not be an offense under either subsection (a) or subsection (b) of this 23 section if, at the time of carrying, the person is abiding by all other federal, state, and local laws and 24 is:

(1) A law enforcement officer; 25

26 (2) Is a member of the United States Armed Forces and on-duty;

- 27 (23) Acting with valid authorization from the city;
- 28 (34) In their own dwelling, place of business, or on property owned or under their 29 control; or

30 (45) Transporting the weapon while travelling within a private automobile or other 31 private means of conveyance for the purposes of hunting or the lawful protection of such person or 32 their property, or another person or that person's property. Except for pistols and revolvers, any 33 firearm being transported must be unloaded during such transport.

- 1 Sec. 38-131. – Firearms prohibited in city-owned or leased buildings where posted. (a) Unlawful to carry firearms in city-owned or leased buildings. Except as provided in 2 3 subsection (d) below, it shall be unlawful for any person to carry any firearm within any building or 4 portion of a building that the city owns or leases, as well as any building or portion of the building 5 leased to the city. 6 (b) Definitions. For purposes of this section, "lease" shall mean any agreement, permit, 7 contract, license, easement, or other instrument and amendment thereto whereby an entity conveys 8 or grants the use, management, operation or control of all or a portion of real property to another. 9 (c) *Penalty*. Any person convicted of violating this section shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the first offense. Thereafter, a violation of this section shall be 10 11 subject to the general penalty identified in D.R.M.C. § 1-13(b). 12 (d) *Exceptions*. It shall not be an offense under this section if, at the time of carrying, the 13 person is abiding by all other federal, state, and local laws and the person is: 14 (1) A law enforcement officer, as defined in 38-116, as amended; (2) A member of the United States Armed Forces and on-duty; 15 16 (3) Licensed by the city as a security guard with a firearms endorsement and acting in 17 performance of their duties; or 18 (4) Acting with valid authorization to carry a weapon at a Denver Police Department 19 or Denver Sheriff Department shooting range. 20 (5) Transporting the weapon while travelling within a private automobile or other 21 private means of conveyance for the purposes of hunting or the lawful protection of such person or 22 their property, or another person or that person's property. Except for pistols and revolvers, any 23 firearm being transported must be unloaded during such transport. 24 (e) Affirmative defenses. It shall be an affirmative defense to this section if, at the time of 25 carrying: 26 (1) The person is carrying the firearm for use in a legitimate sporting activity, including, 27 but not limited to, shooting matches, target shooting, or trap or skeet shooting. The firearm must be 28 unloaded and carried in a case designed for a firearm when not being used during the sporting 29 activity; or 30 (2) The person is wearing, carrying, or transporting the firearm in aid of the civil power 31 when thereto legally summoned. 32 Sec. 38-1312 – 38-145. – Reserved. 33
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1 Section 2. Article I of Chapter 39 shall be amended by adding the language underlined

2 and deleting the language stricken to read as follows:

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Sec. 39-9. – Firearms; weapons; hunting.

4 (d) It shall not be an offense under subsection (a) of this section to possess a firearm within
5 any park, parkway, mountain park, or other recreational facility if, at the time of carrying, the person
6 is abiding by all other federal, state, and local laws and the person is:

- 7 (1) The firearm involved was a handgun and the person holds a valid permit or a
- 8 temporary emergency permit to carry a concealed handgun issued pursuant to state law and is
 9 otherwise carrying the handgun in conformance with any applicable state or local law and is not
 10 engaged in any unlawful use of the firearm; or
- 11 (1) A law enforcement officer, as defined in 38-116, as amended;
 - (2) A member of the United States Armed Forces and on-duty;
- (3) Acting with valid authorization from the city, including but not limited to a person
 licensed by the city as a security guard with a firearms endorsement; or
- 15 (24) The person is c<u>C</u>arrying the firearm within a private automobile or other private 16 means of conveyance for hunting or for lawful protection of such person's or another person's 17 person or property, and the person is otherwise lawfully in possession of the weapon and is not 18 engaging in any unlawful use of the firearm, including hunting in a park, parkway, mountain park or 19 other recreational facility. If the weapon is a firearm being transported for hunting, it shall be 20 unloaded while being carried within the private automobile or other private means of conveyance.
- (e) It shall be an affirmative defense to charges brought under subsection (a) of this section
 if, at the time of carrying:
- (1) The person is carrying the weapon for use in a legitimate sporting activity,
 including, but not limited to, shooting matches, target shooting, or trap or skeet shooting. The firearm
 must be unloaded and carried in a case designed for a firearm when not being used during the
 sporting activity; or
- 27 (2) The person is wearing, carrying, or transporting the firearm in aid of the civil power
 28 when thereto legally summoned.
